

Site owners and developers in Central and Western New York can now compete for \$11 million in available funding for electric vehicle (EV) charging station installations. The New York State Energy Research and Development Authority (NYSERDA) is offering eligible organizations with funds to help offset the costs to install EV direct current fast charging (DCFC) stations in their home Regional Economic Development Council region.



First round applications will be accepted through **February 18, 2021**. Funding will cover:

- Four or more sites with public access (e.g. groceries, retail, restaurants) located at least 10 miles apart
- Minimum 1600 kW of rated charging capacity total, and 400 kW per site
- Up to 80% of cost to install electric vehicle supply equipment (EVSE), including permit costs, five years of network provider costs, and extended warranty costs.

Could fast-charging stations attract new traffic to your site or provide added value to your existing customers? This program will expand Upstate NY's clean transportation network, reduce vehicle carbon emissions, and support the Climate Leadership and Community Protection Act.
